# TOM VILSACK, USDA SECRETARY

Prior to his confirmation as USDA Secretary under President Biden, Vilsack served as the USDA Secretary for all eight years under the Obama Administration. In the interim, he led the U.S. Dairy Export Council for almost four years. He's a former governor of Iowa and was considered as a potential running mate for Hillary Clinton's 2016 presidential campaign. Vilsack's previous experience running the department was a key component in his selection, as the President preferred someone who could immediately tackle the various hunger and farm crises that have been exacerbated by the pandemic.

# JEWEL H. BRONAUGH, USDA DEPUTY SECRETARY



Bronaugh, who is still waiting for confirmation by the Senate, has served as commissioner for the Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services since May 2018, but had previously served as Virginia's state executive director for the USDA Farm Service Agency. She was appointed by then-USDA Secretary Tom Vilsack in 2015. Before leading Virginia's FSA offices, Bronaugh was Dean of the College of Agriculture at Virginia State University (VSU) and oversaw its extension, research, and academic programs.

# National Crop Insurance Convention

In February, AACI, CIRB, and NCIS virtually hosted the joint 2021 Crop Convention featuring guest speakers Senate Agriculture Committee Chairwoman Debbie Stabenow (D-MI) and Ranking Member John Boozman (R-AR), as well as RMA Acting Administrator Richard Flournoy and Agri-Pulse President Sara Wyant.

AACI Chairman Mike Davenport began the virtual session by thanking USDA, especially RMA, for assisting America's producers throughout the COVID pandemic. He noted how the crop insurance program met the needs of America's farmers and ranchers in 2020 in the face of many natural disasters – the derecho, hurricanes, drought, and wildfires among them. Davenport also highlighted AACI's PAC efforts, the recipients of the Champion of Crop Insurance award, and the transition to virtual Congressional outreach due to restrictions from the COVID-19 pandemic.

Davenport then introduced AACI President Scott Graves, who provided an outlook for the association's plans in 2021. These plans include monthly membership calls with Members of Congress, officials in the Biden administration, Capitol Hill staff, and others to update AACI members on events and legislation in Washington, D.C. Graves said the association will reconvene their leadership development program, which was delayed because of the pandemic, and host a virtual spring fly-in in the coming months. Finally, Graves introduced the first guest speaker, Senator John Boozman from Arkansas.

Senator Boozman touched on several topics, from the need to open potential new markets like Cuba and the U.K. to the importance of expanding broadband availability. He highlighted his concerns with Congressional Democrats' plans to address climate change and his opposition in allowing USDA to tap into the Commodity Credit Corporation for carbon credits. He acknowledged it will not be easy to address climate concerns and it will be critical to get input from agriculture stakeholders before any decisions are made with respect to the farming community and climate.

After Senator Boozman spoke, representatives from CIRB provided association updates before introducing guest speaker Senator Debbie Stabenow. Senator Stabenow gave an overview of the provisions of the COVID-19 relief bills and said we need to focus on opening markets and providing market certainty in future. She noted that climate change will be a top priority and that we need to help farmers scale up environmental practices to so they can lead in addressing the issue. She also said she doesn't want to cut any money from existing Farm Bill programs, and thinks we need to support crop insurance and other risk management tools already in place.

Next, NCIS President Tom Zacharias gave an overview of the weather events of 2020 and thanked RMA for their work to assist the industry. NCIS Chair Kendall Jones praised crop insurance for keeping farmers working during these unprecedented times. They then introduced Agri-Pulse President Sara Wyant, who explained there needs to be a heightened focus on science and technology in the agriculture space, especially as we attempt to tackle complicated topics like climate change. She also said it will be interesting to see how the agriculture industry works with Congress and the Administration to address the climate because it's not easily done and there are a lot of differing opinions.



The last speaker of the event was Acting RMA Administrator, Richard Flournoy. First, Flournoy shared the actions that RMA took to meet the needs of producers amidst the pandemic, including extending deadlines, deferring interest, and allowing self-certification for replant inspections and witness waivers.He also provided topline numbers from 2020 such as: **prevented** plant (10.3 million acres; \$1.7 billion in losses), hurricane insurance protection (17.6k policies with \$645 million in liabilities; \$146 million in losses), the derecho (\$300 million in losses, mostly IA), and drought & PRF (\$2.8 billion in losses). Flournoy went through improvements made to the various livestock programs and noted other program highlights related to quality loss, specialty crop coverage, expanded written agreements, and hemp pilot expansion. Flournoy finished with his outlook for 2021 and said he expects an increase in liability and premium with potential for a new record in liability of as much as \$130 billion.
